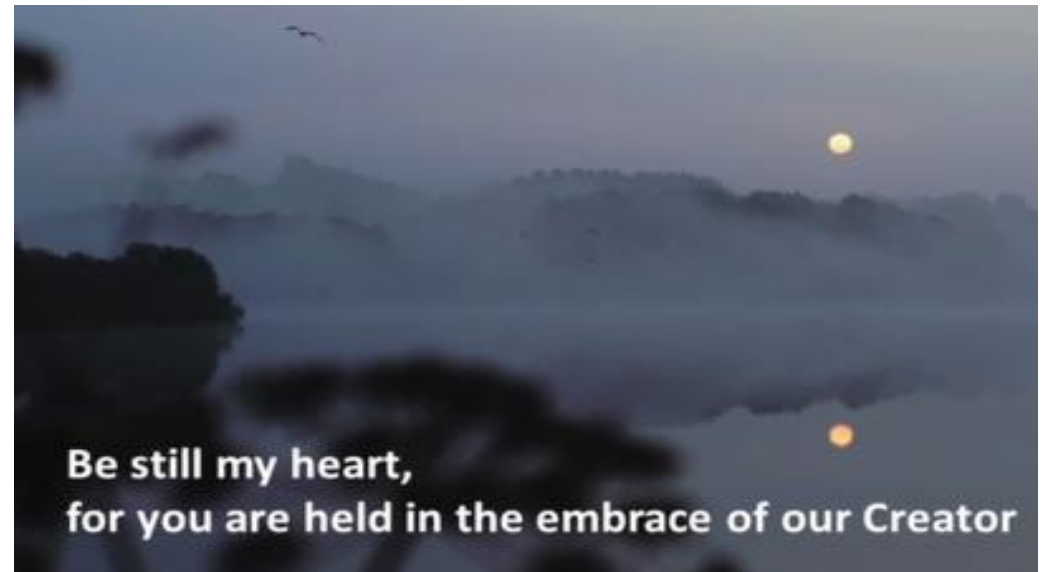
Prayers for w/c 1 November **ALL SAINTS' DAY**
