Bible Study of the **Book of Ruth**

Session 2: Kindness and Blessing

Ponder: Sometimes when you meet up with someone you have not seen for a while they ask; "How are you doing?" What do you tell them? Is it all positive and upbeat or do you share with them the reality? On returning to Bethlehem, Naomi receives a

wonderful reception, but she has changed. Does Naomi tell them the truth?

Opening Prayer: (see Appendix 1)

Read: Ruth: 1:19 – 22

Why does the town respond with excitement at Naomi's return?

Has there been a time in your life when you received a kindness or blessing that you were not expecting? What was it and did you recognise it?

Does Naomi remind you of other literal, movie or biblical characters?

Activity: Listen to *Irresistible*: Hillsong Worship - You Tube (2017)

Read: Ruth: 2:1-13

What does Boaz do for Ruth? How does this go above and beyond what is required?

What are the possible reasons Boaz reaches out to Ruth and what does the way Boaz speaks to Ruth tell us about his character?

Activity: Write a Gratitude or Blessing Prayer. Boaz indicates he will become God's wings over Ruth and Naomi. The following "wing" passages may help you: Psalm 17:5-8 or Psalm 91:4.

Going Deeper: Research the background to the laws surrounding care of the poor and vulnerable, (Deuteronomy 10:17-18).

Twenty-first Relevance: In your everyday life what could you contribute to make life better? Is there someone who needs your love and kindness? How could you respond?

Closing Prayer: Pray for each other or in pairs, asking for God's favour or blessing on your situation.

Appendix 1

Suggested prayers:

"Our Father in heaven, creator and sustainer of your world, you hold all that you have made within your gracious providence. We thank you for the rich freedom you have given us. Help us in all things to see your hand, and to live as those whose lives are entrusted to your sovereign care. As Ruth from Moab became one of your people, so you call us by name and invite us home. We are glad to find shelter under the refuge of your wings."
